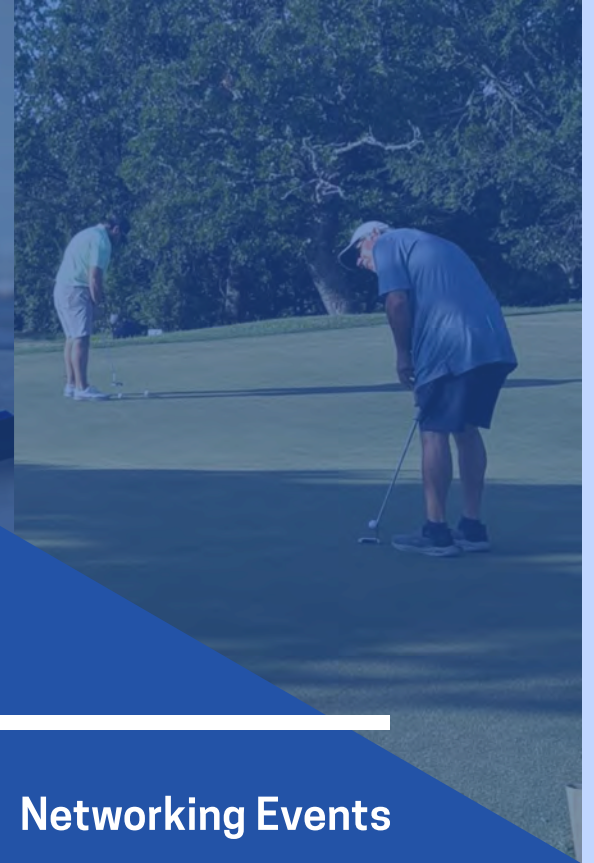

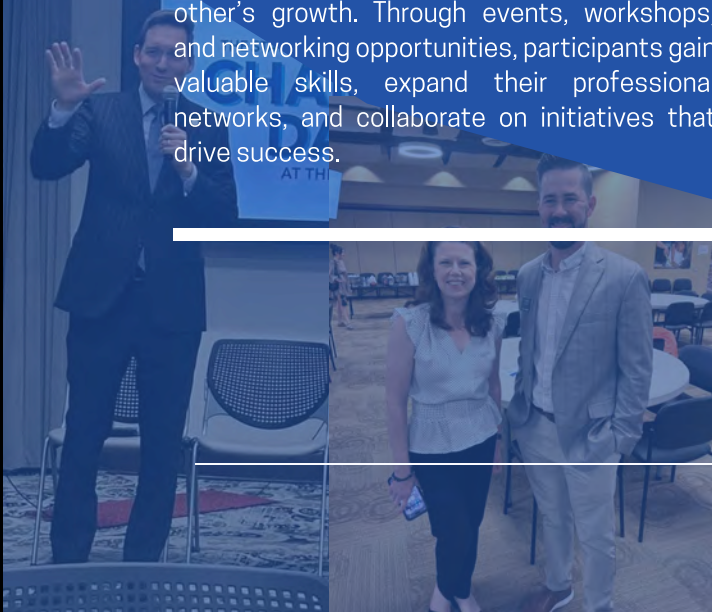


Ambassadors

Leadership McAlester

Growing Leaders, Strengthening Community

Every year, Leadership McAlester brings together a group of emerging leaders to learn more about their community, strengthen their leadership skills, and make a difference through a hands-on service project. The program, organized by the Chamber of Commerce, is designed to connect participants with one another while also connecting them more deeply to McAlester.

For the class of 2025, that difference-making project is focused on a landmark that has quietly marked the hours in the heart of the city: the McAlester Centennial Clock.

Installed in 2007 as part of Oklahoma's centennial celebration, McAlester's clock is one of more than 130 placed around the state, with at least one in every county. For years, the clock stood at the intersection of South First Street and East Choctaw Avenue, serving as both a functional timepiece and a reminder of the city's role in Oklahoma's history.



Time and weather, however, have taken their toll. The clock's interior filled with rainwater, causing damage that led to its removal in 2024. Since then, it has been stored while plans are made for restoration.

That is where this year's Leadership McAlester class stepped in. The group has taken on the responsibility of restoring the clock and ensuring its return to public display. Once the work is complete, the Centennial Clock will have a new home at Arvest Park, located at the corner of Second Street and Chickasaw Avenue.

By choosing the Centennial Clock, the 2025 class is ensuring that a piece of McAlester's heritage continues to stand tall for future generations. Just as importantly, they are leaving a legacy of leadership that blends community service with civic pride.

Leadership McAlester is more than a professional development program. It is a chance for participants to work together on projects that create visible, lasting improvements. The restoration and relocation of the Centennial Clock is a perfect example of how one class can contribute to the city's future while honoring its past. ●

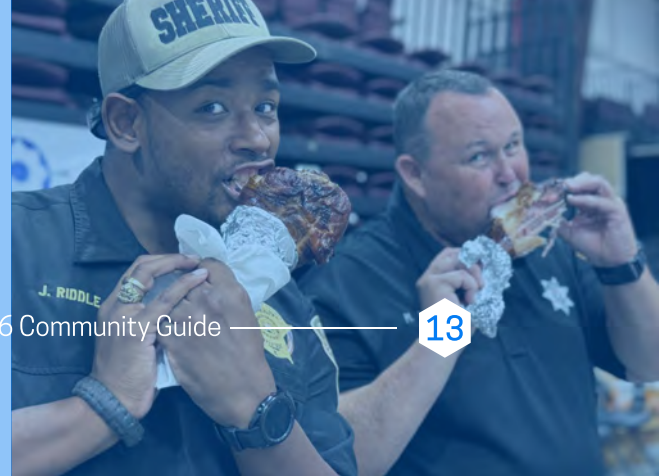

EXPLORING THE MCALESTER URBAN TRAILS



Just north of downtown, the McAlester Urban Trails provide residents and visitors with a place to walk, run, bike, and connect with nature without ever leaving the city limits. Designed to be both accessible and adventurous, the trails offer something for everyone, from casual walkers to dedicated mountain bikers.

The trail system includes wide double-track paths perfect for walking, jogging, or enjoying a peaceful ride. For those seeking a challenge, single-track trails are available with varying degrees of difficulty, making the system appealing to both beginners and experienced cyclists. With routes that weave through shaded areas, open stretches, and scenic views, the trails deliver a fresh outdoor experience each time you visit.

One of the highlights of the system is the Glen Stone Trail, named in honor of Glen Stone, a respected coach and community figure known for his contributions to track and field. The trail not only recognizes his legacy but also reflects the community's long-standing dedication to creating spaces that encourage active living.

The Urban Trails came to life thanks to the vision and determination of four local residents: Randy Saunier, Blake Lynch, Jeff Mann, and Richard Peckio. Their shared goal of building a recreational space for McAlester inspired years of planning, collaboration, and volunteer work. Together, they transformed a simple idea into a thriving trail system that now serves as one of the city's most popular outdoor destinations.

Their efforts have created more than just paths through the woods. They have built a gathering place where neighbors can meet, families can explore, and newcomers can feel welcome. The trails reflect McAlester's spirit of working together, honoring local history, and building amenities that improve quality of life for everyone.

Beyond recreation, the trails also support McAlester's growing tourism appeal. Cycling enthusiasts often travel across the region to explore trail systems, and McAlester is positioning itself as a destination along that route. With an expanding network that will eventually connect to downtown, the trails have the potential to bring new energy and economic activity to local businesses.

For new residents, the McAlester Urban Trails are a great introduction to the city's outdoor lifestyle. Whether you are here for a day or making McAlester your new home, the trails invite you to get outside, explore, and be part of a growing tradition. ●

In addition, we're exploring new dirt-bike trails, expanded skate parks, and other recreation zones that cater to a wide variety of interests—from adrenaline seekers to those





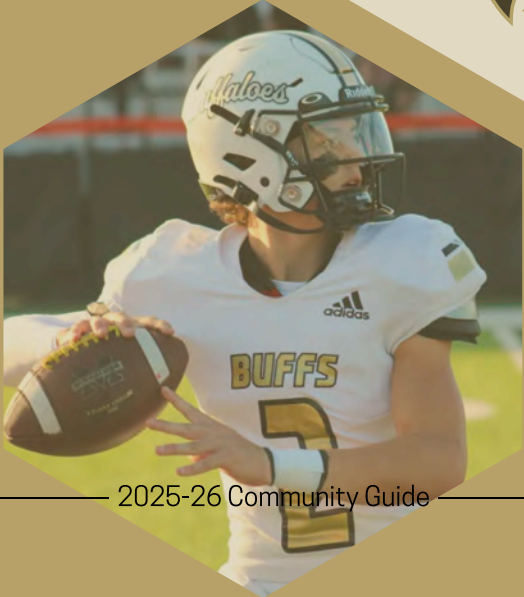

McAlester Chamber to Host Inaugural Civic Bee

The McAlester Chamber of Commerce is proud to announce it will host its first Civic Bee, becoming one of only five chambers in Oklahoma selected to participate in the 2026 National Civics Bee®. The competition, created by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation, is designed to inspire middle school students to engage with civics and learn how they can strengthen their communities.

The National Civics Bee® invites 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students to showcase their ideas through essays and live competitions. Students are asked to identify a problem in their community, propose a solution, and connect their ideas to America's founding principles and civic virtues. Local winners advance to state competitions, and top finalists will ultimately have the chance to compete in the national championship in Washington, D.C.

Chambers of Commerce across the nation have joined forces with the National Civics Bee because civic knowledge in America is on the decline. According to the National Assessment of Educational Progress, only 22 percent of 8th graders scored proficient or above in civics in 2022, while just 13 percent met proficiency in U.S. history. Even more concerning, scores in civics dropped for the first time since the assessment began in 1998. Adult knowledge isn't much stronger: a U.S. Chamber Foundation survey found that more than 70 percent of Americans failed a basic civics literacy quiz, despite 93 percent saying they believe civics education is important.

For chambers like ours, this effort goes beyond business. Strong communities depend on informed and engaged citizens, and by encouraging students to think critically about their role in civic life, we are investing in the future of McAlester. Civic education empowers students to see themselves as capable of making change, prepares them for leadership, and ensures that our democracy remains strong.

Participation in the competition is free, and students from public, private, charter, and homeschool settings are eligible. Essays must be submitted by February 3, 2026, and should include four parts: identifying a community issue, proposing a solution, outlining who could help implement it, and connecting the idea to a civic principle or virtue. Submissions will be judged on clarity, originality, feasibility, and how well the ideas tie back to civic values.

The McAlester Chamber encourages students, teachers, parents, and community leaders to get involved. We are working with McAlester Public Schools on this initiative, and hosting the Civic Bee is a chance to highlight the talents of our young people while celebrating the importance of civic engagement in a thriving community.

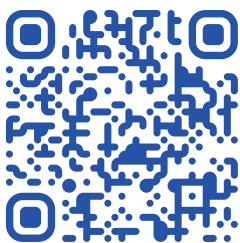
